This expands the CMS footprint into Illinois, bringing the total number of clinics to 68 locations in 11 states.

More than 1,500 Americans per week die from taking an opioid, according to the National Center for Health Statistics, making opioids by far the leading cause of fatal overdoses in the country. In recent years, the illegal manufacture and distribution of synthetic opioids such as fentanyl has driven a dramatic increase in overdose deaths. The services that both CMS and BRIGHTSIDE provide offer treatment options that help address this epidemic, with the goal of improving quality of life and enabling those with OUD to regain control of their lives, reducing the possibility of overdose.

One of CMS's core Values is, "We are evangelists for practices grounded in science and evidence", and CMS is committed to continually tracking patient outcomes to stay on the leading edge of providing paths to healing for those with OUD. Recent outcomes reporting from CMS's Chief Science Officer, Dr. Robert Sherrick, found that among the Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) factors the clinics actively track, within 6 months of treatment CMS patients see a 49% increase in employment and a 12% increase in permanent housing, and a 5% - 7% decrease in feelings of anxiety and depression upon 90 days in treatment.

This partnership will bring services to even more people in need in Illinois and fuel growth in opioid treatment throughout the Midwest.
